

Cholera Kills 15 At Dacca Jute Mill

DACCA, Bangladesh, Jan. 2 — Fifteen people have died in a suspected cholera outbreak at a Dacca jute mill where some 30,000 Bihari Moslems have taken refuge, doctors reported today.

Red Cross officials visited the mill today for the first time.

Meanwhile, two more bodies have been found floating in a small pond in the Rayabazar area of Dacca where scores of Bengali intellectuals were massacred three weeks ago.

There has been no official count of the number of people killed at Rayabazar, but the figure is generally put at about 150.
