

Thousands Killed In India Riots

LONDON, November 11.—In the United Provinces of India there were eight cases of stabbing after the curfew was lifted this morning to enable the people to obtain their rations. The curfew was reimposed.

Three more stabbings were reported from Bombay.

Twenty-seven men, women and children perished last night in a new outbreak of communal fury when a mob burned a Moslem quarter in the hamlet of Harsom within 15 miles of Delhi.

A. K. Fazlul, former Moslem Premier of Bengal who has just returned to Calcutta from a tour of riot-affected areas of Bihar where Hindus are in the majority, placed the number of killed "somewhere in the neighbourhood of thirty thousand" as a result of riots there. Speaking at a press interview he said the number killed was roughly five or six times more than the number injured.

The head of the All-India Moslem League, Mr. Jinnah, today appealed to Moslems to protect non-Moslems and create security and health among them. He cautioned the Moslems that their present actions would be catastrophic for India both morally and politically.
